



Town Centre Route

A 1¼ mile route covering 8 historic sites in Walton-on-Thames, extendable to a 3½ mile route covering 11 sites.

START at WoTTA totem outside Nationwide. Proceed along Church Street

Admiral Rodney's House.
Born here in 1718.

The Regent
Once one of three cinemas in Walton.

St Mary's Church
With an amazing North bell

Follow Church Walk, turn right into Churchfield Road and left into High Street.

Ireton's House
General Ireton married one of Oliver Cromwell's daughters
Now Click, Save & Print.

Walton War Memorial

Elm Grove House
Holiday home of last Tsar of Russia and his family.

For short route, proceed down New Zealand Avenue. For long route, follow Hershman Road for 1 mile, turn right under railway bridge into West Grove.

The White House
100 West Grove, Hershman
American President Herbert Hoover lived here.
Built in 1768.

Re-trace your steps. Turn left into Mayfield Road. Pass through station subway, turn right into Station Avenue.

Return to START by crossing New Zealand Avenue then through The Heart Centre.

Walton Cricket Club
Where 'Lumpy' Stevens introduced the third middle stump to cricket.

Ashley Park
Site of filming the TV series 'The Adventures of Robin Hood' in the 1950s and site of the first recorded game of baseball in 1749.

Turn left into Ashley Park Avenue, then right to car park.

At traffic lights, turn left and return along Hershman Road to War Memorial. Turn left into New Zealand Avenue.

Site of Former Birds Eye Building
Was Grade II listed. Classic 60's style. Site of 'Homeland' filming. Now replaced by Walton Court Gardens apartments.

Flt. Sgt. Charles Sydney Memorial Plaque
commemorating his Spitfire crash. Temporarily removed for building work.
